The director and co-founder of the foundation, Mary Anne Mohanraj, says that this is a wonderful tool for anyone who is interested in any form of speculative literature financially or for entertainment.

“What makes this site great is that it takes all of the speculative literature websites and compiles them into one huge collection of information that is easy to maneuver,” said Mohanraj. “There is really nothing like it for spec lit on the internet.”

The resources collected on the website includes grants that assist up-and-coming and veteran writers, guides to academic and professional programs, a calendar of science fiction conventions, relevant booklists for readers, and much more. The Foundation puts special emphasis on financial assistance designed as ‘gateway’ grants with no entry fees or application processes, and fiscal sponsorships.
